<u>Civil Air Patrol Lease Consideration:</u> The Commissioners agreed to a 5-year lease extension. MOTION CARRIED unanimously to give the Civil Air Patrol a 5-year lease extension (M/S Shelly Rivard Detrick / Karen Moore).

- 1. <u>Overhead Circulation Fans:</u> MOTION CARRIED unanimously to purchase and install new overhead circulation fans (M/S Shelly Rivard Detrick / Karen Moore).
- 2. <u>Replacement Light Fixtures:</u> MOTION CARRIED unanimously to purchase and install new light fixtures (M/S Shelly Rivard Detrick / Karen Moore).

# **OPERATIONS and MAINTENANCE:**

<u>Building #2:</u> An overall inspection of industrial building two was completed. During the inspection, we found sixteen 1000-watt metal halide lights that were inoperable (ballasts were burned out). It would be a more cost-effective repair to replace these with LED lights. The two 20ft diameter overhead ceiling recirculation fans were not operational. An in-depth inspection found the controllers on both fans were not functioning due to harmonic vibration from the three-phase motor. I suspect that this was the reason for the wiring being disconnected to the controllers initially. I contacted the manufacturer about parts availability, unfortunately they no longer manufacture parts or motors for these particular fans.

<u>Craftsman Mower:</u> The mower was serviced and new cutting blades were installed.

<u>Safety Cage</u>: The cage received a final coat of paint and is ready to be used.

<u>Taxi-way Signs:</u> The remaining new taxi-way signs were installed.

## FROM THE OFFICE:

<u>Point of Clarification, Covid Leave:</u> The Commissioners agree that all Covid-related leave will be additional paid leave granted by the Port at this time. Because payroll had already been completed prior to this decision, one week of sick leave will be credited back to Gordy.
